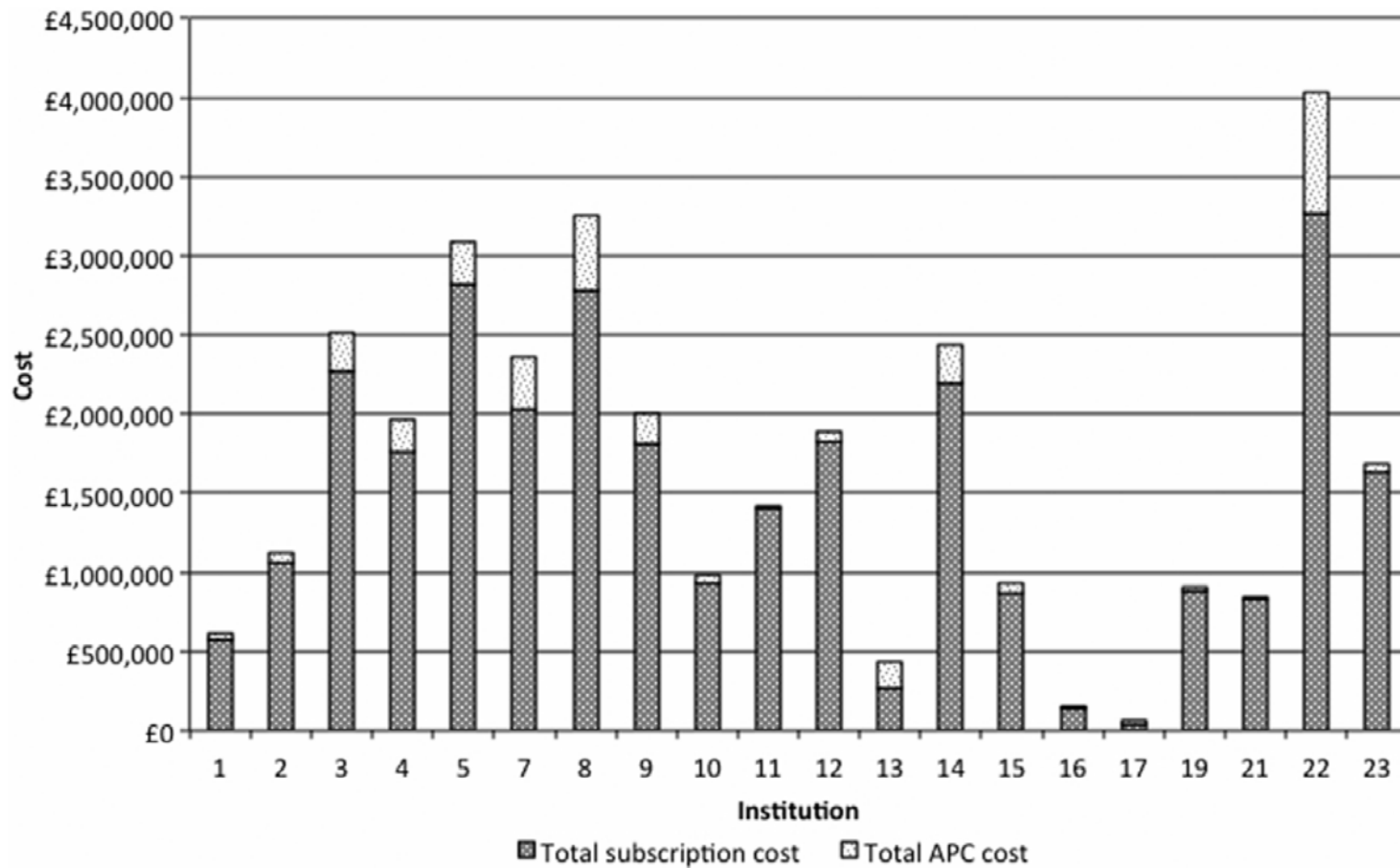


FIG. 6. Total cost of publication, 2013 (excluding administrative costs) for institutions.

Science Online subscription renewal



Science AAAS publisher, is taking advantage of its dominant position and trying to impose not only an unjustified price increase, but also new contract terms, which are very restrictive and as a result unacceptable for us

05/12/2014 - Further to new unacceptable contractual conditions, the EPFL decided not to renew its subscription to Science Online. Hence online access could be cut from December 13, 2014 on. However, back files will remain accessible, as well as the printed issues.

Lib4RI will no longer provide full access to all journals of the **American Physical Society (APS)**. As of now Lib4RI only offers access to the most frequently used e-journals **Physical Review B** and **Physical Review Letters**. Additionally, this access is restricted to users of PSI.

The decision on this significant reduction was jointly made by the library itself and the library's steering committee (consisting of 4 members of the directorates and 4 scientists). The reason for the decision lies in **the intention of APS**

Open access

The arrival of the Internet radically changed opportunities for disseminating scientific knowledge. Digitisation has meant that potentially anyone with Internet access can benefit from new scientific insights. Open access aims to make findings from scientific research (particularly that financed through public funding) freely available online to as many people as possible. Dutch universities strongly support open access and have been working to achieve it in various ways over the past few years.

Recently, the topic has come under the scrutiny of the government too. In a letter to the Lower House, the state secretary took the view that publicly funded research should, in principle, be freely accessible. Like the United Kingdom, he has recommended a policy of pursuing the [gold route](#). His aim is that in ten years from now (2024), 100 percent of Dutch scientific publications

Negotiations: many open access publications Springer, new proposals Wiley Sage and OUP.

Koen Becking (Tilburg University) and Gerard Meijer (Radboud Universiteit Nijmegen) are currently negotiating with publishers about subscriptions to academic journals. The universities are only prepared to renew current subscription agreements if the publishers take steps towards open access. An overview of the latest negotiation developments per publisher:

Wiley, Sage and Oxford University Press: new proposals

Successful discussions have recently been held with Wiley, Sage and the Oxford University Press. All three indicate they would like to move towards open access, but that such a move is complicated due to the high percentage of 'society publications'. Speaking on behalf of the universities, the negotiators indicated that open access is a requirement for new contracts and that 'double dipping' must be prevented. The three publishers will soon be presenting a new proposal.
